A NEW YEAR WORD FROM
HERMANO GLEN

“As the rain and snow come down from heaven and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth: it will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it. **You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace...” Isaiah 55:10 – 12)**

At the close of every year I find myself reviewing the accomplishments of the ministry and attempting to see all that God has done and is doing. But when I find myself getting lost in the numbers, I am reminded of something an encouraging friend often tells me. “Be sure you count the things a man cannot count.” So, I stop and thank the Lord for what I can count and I ask Him to remind me of what only He can do. Have you ever filled your hand with Bermuda grass seeds and tried to count them? Or throw those seeds on some good top soil, water them, and a few days later gone back and tried to count the blades of grass? You might be able to count the signs or VW bugs as you are driving down the highway, but try counting the bluebonnets after a good spring rain.

I really do think God has enough time to count the grass and the bluebonnets and the little children at VBS, the macho man, who in his heart prays a silent prayer, the prison guard that pulls a Gospel tract out of the inmates care package and follows the instructions to make Jesus his Lord, the great grandma who has suffered a stroke and can no longer speak whose eyes tell God all He needs to know as her spirit cries out for salvation, and He counts every syllable of every word spoken by His children in His name as valuable and capable of producing eternal fruit.

Just a short report of the last team of the year would reveal an incredible amount of humanly visible fruit. Like 327 salvations, thousands of Gospel tracts distributed, hundreds of care packages given to the poor, and the building of a 5000 square foot dorm to house impoverished youth and give them an opportunity for a brighter future. But I question myself whether or not I would readily tell you about Christina, a twenty-year-old young lady, who seven years earlier accepted Christ with one of our Christmas team members, and now serves as a translator? Would I tell you about Juan Rodriguez and his wife Beth, his son Juan Jr., and his daughter Angela who showed up at our final worship to say thank you for bringing Jesus into our lives three years ago and to share the joy his whole family has in serving Jesus within a local church?

In a world where numbers matter, bigger is better, and success is determined by the bottom line we sometimes need to be reminded that every ONE that goes to share the Gospel and demonstrate the love of Christ to another never does so in vain. God’s Spirit does what no man can count and if we ask Him, He will reveal the ONES we are sent to find. So, I encourage you in this New Year to go out and share the Gospel with ONE and ask the Lord to do what only He can do.
