OUT OF AFRICA

“JESUS WENT THROUGH ALL THE TOWNS AND VILLAGES, TEACHING AND PREACHING THE GOOD NEWS AND HEALING THE SICK. WHEN HE SAW THE CROWDS, HE HAD COMPASSION ON THEM, BECAUSE THEY WERE HARASSED AND HELPLESS, LIKE SHEEP WITHOUT A SHEPHERD.” (Matthew 9:35-36)

One of the many things that never cease to amaze me about my walk with Christ is how He allows scripture to come alive with 20/20 visibility. I have experienced this passage many times in Matthews Gospel but most of the time I recall the following verse that says, “Pray to the God of the harvest to send out workers.” Seldom are the faces of the crowds and the desperation of being without hope etched on them so pronounced as they were in Ghana. I thank God for the workers God has raised up there and it was sheer joy to walk in their harvest field during the past two weeks.

During this glorious week we saw several hundred accept Christ, Planted five new Churches and Baptized over two hundred who had previously made professions of faith. It was a special celebration at Ditney Baptist, the mother church of well over 160 newly planted congregations. The celebration concluded a women’s conference, lead by the women on the team, which saw some three hundred Ghanaian women in attendance, most had walked twenty to sixty miles to attend. Our ladies looked like five white porcelain dolls in a sea of beautiful colors. I never thought anyone would one up the Mexicans when it came to the use of many colors but the African people have taken tie dying to a whole new level.

I know many of you were praying for me and the team from Saint Andrews Baptist Church in Panama City, Florida, while we were in Ghana, Africa. There was no doubt in my mind that a great number of prayer warriors were on their knees, lifting this effort up to our Lord. I would love to know how many of you were compelled by the spirit to pray for rain. It had not rained in North East Ghana for some five months and the farm crop season was threatened, which would have spelled starvation for many. As soon as we arrived we joined the Ditney Baptist Church and Pastor Immanuel Mustapha interceding for the people and asking for rain. I felt a calm peace that before we departed God would send rain. Although it sprinkled a couple of times the real rain held off until Sunday the last day of our trip. Yes right as the last shout of “AMEM, AMEN” came the thunder and the windows of heaven opened.

I thank God for providing me with this unforgettable experience. I have a larger prayer now and I will truly enjoy talking with my Jesus about my Brothers Muss, Peter (Smiley), Manasa, Ima, Fransisco, John the Cop, Joseph and Big Tom. I want to ask you to join with me as well. While in Ghana we began the process of putting together a mission team from Ghana to come to Mexico in October of 09 and serve alongside our Mexican brothers. I believe God will use this team in a tremendous way to encourage and compel the Mexican church to become ends of the earth goers.

Please be in Prayer May 30th thru June 7th for a team from Farmstead Baptist who will be serving in Brazil. God is doing great things to reach Brazil and this team will need our prayers.

Also be in prayer for the SABC youth who will join me in Zacatecas on June 1st thru 7th as we conduct a much needed youth outreach.

Oh! yes, we managed to drag our ladies to the airport with out taking a little African baby home, which might be a miracle in itself.
