This is one of those times in my life when I am humbled and awed. I find myself constantly thanking God for devoted followers of Christ and faithful harvest field workers. Their love for God causes them to obey His command to go, despite all the media’s negative reports about Mexico. During a time when even the leaders of our denominations are giving in to a spirit of fear and advising churches to do the same, we have seen some of the most fruitful days of our ministry. From the bottom of my heart, I say thank you to those who traveled to the Black Heart of Mexico, and allowed our Lord to live in and through you.

In an area where evangelical Christians are disliked, persecuted, and ridiculed daily, it is always an exercise of faith to attempt to establish new works. However, the rewards far outweigh the obstacles and struggles that we are asked to overcome. During these days, our constant prayer is to the Lord of the harvest, asking Him to send the workers into the field, ripe for harvest. Trust me, God is faithful, and He hears and answers our prayers.

Three teams came and assisted local churches to establish four new works and to strengthen an established church in a struggling community. We asked our American missionaries to forget about numbers and begging people to pray a prayer, and instead, we asked them to concentrate on seeking out the Zacchaeus’ within these hard communities. The raw truth is, when we find people who seriously want to know Jesus and learn the Bible, we find the foundation of a lasting work. Yes, several confessed Jesus as their Lord, however, the truly exciting part is that in all four locations people came to the local Bible studies to make a public profession. This is a testament to what has taken place in their hearts.

Join me in praying for the Mexican churches, and especially Luis Martinez and Israel Rodriguez, as they present the vision of the Church Planters Training Center and the vision to reach the under-evangelized areas of Mexico and other Latin American countries. It is also time to start getting ready for the CrossVision Family Mission Trip to Piedras Negras. This year will include working with several of the church planters in training and developing some new works. Again, I covet your prayers, and please know we can only continue to serve the Lord with the generous support of God’s faithful givers.
